



"The Jesus Tension"

Jesus loves a paradox, loves the tension of two opposite things revealing a truth when they come together. The first shall be last; death leads to eternal life; those who hunger will be filled; in losing your life you will gain; the poor are rich; to lead is to serve. These statements and assertions from Jesus on his teachings are meant to draw us in to look at the world differently, and they shock, too. Jesus wants us to grow in depth of faith and spirit. When we examine statements like the ones above, and really try to digest them with our heart and mind, they lead us to new areas of exploration .

We are in route to Holy Week where we will experience the final hours of Jesus' life, and the paradoxes become more pronounced with life altering faith statements! Jesus gets on his knees and washes the feet of his disciples. Jesus shares in a meal with those whom he trusts most when in a short time will betray him, abandon him, and deny him. God the Son, suffers and dies on the cross. Yes, we really believe God dies. And in superb triumph, God rises. Embrace the story, embrace the tension, embrace the mystery of our faith.

In your embracing, how might it affect your interaction with others? Will you take on Christ's humility? Will your faith be reinforced, where you can stand to your feet proudly to celebrate the blessings God has made possible for you? What role will you take on in the story of Christ's final hours? Will you be one who stands on the road shouting, "Hosanna"; or maybe you will contemplate how you act in similar ways to the disciples who flee and run? Could we take on the role of Pontius Pilot, one who condemns Jesus to death, or perhaps we will be one the stands at the foot of the cross watching our Lord go through such agony? Could we be the thief next to Jesus seeking to be remembered when Jesus enters his kingdom?

Any role we may take is to be a route of tension for holding the truth that in death comes eternal life, in strife and pain comes a new day of blessings. Do the tough work of faith, friends. Don't shy away from the truth. Embrace the Truth! Embrace the Tension! Embrace that God the Son, dies and rises and gives us a new day!







Dear Goddard Friends,




