

#### WHAT IS LENT AND WHY DOES IT LAST 40 DAYS?



Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. In many other languages, the word used for this season refers to the 40-day length of the season (*cuaresma* in Spanish and Tagalog, *carême* in French, *quaresima* in Italian) or to the fasting that characterizes it (*Fastenzeit* in German, *fastan* in Swedish, *paasto* in Finnish, *posta* in Russian).

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.



Holy Week is the final week of Lent, beginning with Passion/Palm Sunday and concluding with Holy Saturday. The Great Three Days—also called the Triduum or Pasch—from sunset Holy Thursday through sunset Easter Day are the climax of Lent (and of the whole Christian year) and a bridge into the Easter Season. These days proclaim the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

#### **Artistry in Wood**

The outstanding creations pictured here were created by Chuck Johnson. He and Sandy, kids Trish and David, came to Goddard in 1971. Over the years Chuck has served on numerous committees and continues to be active in the church.

Chuck began his foray into woodworking after retiring from Rheem Mfg., were he was an engineer. He started



out making large yard Christmas displays, some of which he still uses. The bear and raccoon are examples of a style called **Intarsia**, where the pieces are cut from different species of wood, selected by their color, to create a mosaic-like "picture". The pieces are then sanded and glued to a backing, making them ready to display. Chuck recently began creating Nativity scenes ranging from 3" to 8" tall using his scroll saw for the cut-outs and intricate details. And what woodworker doesn't enjoy making small toys, like wooden trains and cars that make a kid's face light up? For Chuck, "It's a great hobby and I encourage anyone interested in wood working to give it a try." Beautiful work Chuck!




